Davis International Scholars Program

Information for Candidates and their Families

Overview

For the fourth year, ASSIST is working closely with four schools of the Davis International Scholars Program. Therefore, candidates can express an interest in being considered for both scholarships – ASSIST and Davis – being offered through this competition.

The Davis Program

The Davis International Scholars Program offers students the opportunity to earn a scholarship to attend an independent boarding school in the U.S. that is a member of this program. Students attend the schools for two or three years and stay to earn a diploma. After graduation, if students are accepted to any one of 86 universities in the U.S. affiliated with the Davis Program, funding from the Program continues at \$20,000 per year for four years.

The number of Davis Scholarships is very limited – only eight worldwide – so we advise candidates to apply for a Davis Scholarship in addition to an ASSIST scholarship. After the interviews, if students in the scholarship competition are chosen to become Davis Scholarship candidates, they will apply directly to one of the Davis schools for admission. There is no program fee charged to families, but families must pay the personal expenses of their children (airfare, spending money, health insurance, books and supplies, etc.)

Each applicant indicating an interest in the Davis Program must complete a financial aid application and submit it with the other paperwork. The funds are reserved for students whose families genuinely need financial assistance.
